WHY: FAST ACT – 49 U.S.C. 70202

- National Highway Freight Program Funding
 - States MUST Develop a State Freight Plan
- Multimodal critical rural freight facilities and corridors

 Critical rural and urban freight corridors



CUFC/CRFC Evaluation Criteria

- Network
- Access to Jobs
- FTZ sites
- Congestion/delay
- Intermodal Facilities
- Top 100 Freight Generator
- International Port of Entry

FAST ACT - Freight Performance Measure

- Truck Travel Time Reliability (TTTR) on Interstates
- 2- and 4-year targets, due by May 20, 2018
- Baseline performance report due Oct. 2018

For Connected and Productive Communities






Evolution of Freight Planning in PA







Pennsylvania's Geographical Context






Freight Moved in Pennsylvania (tonnage)

- System Preservation > Stewardship






Pennsylvania's TOP 100 Truck Bottlenecks

- ATRI's truck GPS 2013 Database
- Interstate and National Highway System
- Analysis of average speeds
- Generated congestion index
 - Over 6,000 Pennsylvania highway segments
- Segments are a mile or less


